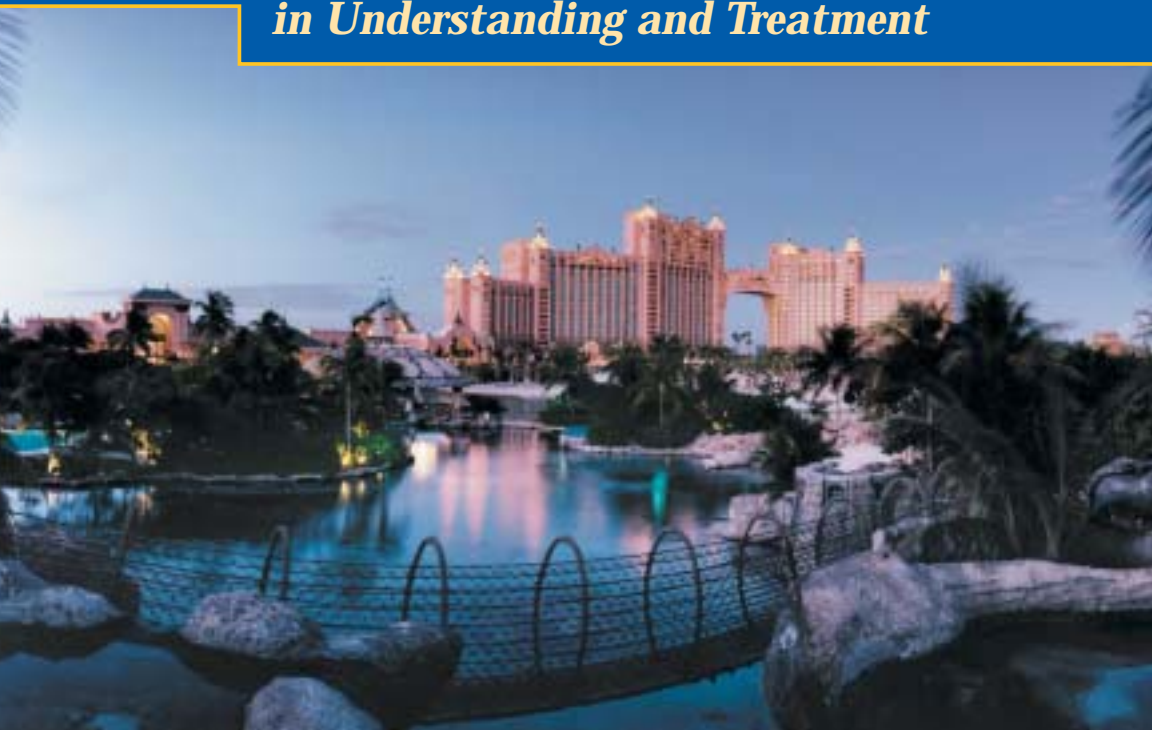

Parkinson's Disease and Other Movement Disorders: New Advances in Understanding and Treatment



November 11 - 13, 2004

Course Description

The course will provide participants with exposure to all major movement disorders topics through video presentations, didactic lectures, and case discussions with faculty specializing in the diagnosis, care and management of these disorders in adults and children. New treatment strategies for the most common clinical problems that frequently accompany movement disorders (restless legs syndrome, depression, dementia, sleep disturbances, etc.) will also be discussed such that participants will be equipped to institute many of these strategies immediately in their own practices.

Course Objectives

At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Discuss new treatments for restless legs syndrome.
- Identify specific movement disorders, such as Parkinsonism, tremor, dystonia, Tourette's syndrome.
- Diagnose disease states through video case presentations.
- Evaluate medical treatment options for movement disorders.
- Differentiate gait disorders.
- Devise appropriate treatment plan for gait disorders.
- Explain management options for behavioral and psychological disorders that commonly accompany movement disorders.
- Identify patients who may benefit from botulinum toxin treatment.
- Evaluate surgical treatment options for movement disorders.
- Evaluate pediatric movement disorders.

Who Should Attend

This course is designed for family physicians, internal medicine physicians, neurologists, physician assistants and nurse practitioners.

Credit

Mayo Foundation is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) to provide continuing medical education (CME) for physicians.

Location

Atlantis Paradise Island Resort, the prime destination within the Bahamas, is just 25 minutes by taxi from Nassau International Airport. General Information

Immigration identification: U.S. and Canadian citizens may use a passport or two forms of ID, i.e., a certified birth certificate and a driver's license (one form must have a photo). A return flight airlines ticket and sufficient funds to support the stay are required.

Currency: You may use U.S. currency and travelers checks. The Bahamian dollar is based on the American currency system, 100 cents to the dollar. Major credit cards are accepted throughout the islands by shops, hotels and restaurants.

Airlines to Nassau International Airport: Air Canada, American Eagle, Bahamas Air, Continental/Continental Connection, Delta Air Lines, Island Express, TWA and US Airways serve this airport.

Departure tax: Upon your departure you will pay a nominal departure tax, currently \$15. Children under six are free.

Transportation: Major car rental companies operate here. Taxis are available and charge by zone. There are fixed charges for some trips around the island.
