GREETINGS FROM THE PRESIDENT

Another year with our annual reunion rapidly approaching. This year we will be celebrating the graduates of 1944, 1949, 1954, 1064, 1969, and my class of 1959, celebrating our 50th. The class of '59 was a special one. Sister Julie thought we were born ahead of our time. our class was an exceptionally close class perhaps related to all the trouble we caused making changes to the usual traditions.

I didn't travel much this past year. Russia last May and returning to United Arab Emirates in the Fall was the extent of my traveling. The economy has kept me on a short leash. A Christmas cruise that I had planned for my family was postponed due to my son's Air Force recall to Afghanistan. Hopefully, we'll all go this December.

In April, I had a cochlear implant hoping to improve my hearing as hearing aids do not help my type of hearing loss. I have had only 15% hearing all my life (depending upon lip reading) and was excited to think this might change. So far the results have not been positive. I was so hoping to be able to hear your responses at the reunion but this is not to be. So you'll have to continue to put with my Norwegian stubbornest and my inability to hear.

Last year's reunion gathered 129 alumni and guests. Kay Bach Entiwistle represented the class of 1958 with Mary Streit Lent representing the class of 1948. Mary's class was the last class of cadet nurse of WWII. Mary, if you all remember made the early student nurse uniforms for our centennial celebration. Sister Generose spoke on the Vanderstein Fund and the Poverella Fund. The group sang Happy Birthday to Sister Generose who will be 90 this coming September.

Though our investments for the Alumni are few, our returns this year were not good either. Which brings me to the current status of our proposed Saint Marys School of Nursing recognition. We have been informed by the Mayo Clinic nothing can be accomplished at this time. As soon as the economy improves we will move forward on this project. The Alumni Board is looking at various methods to speed this process. To move forward on the project, we may need to be responsible for the cost. We do have funds that we could utilize. What would your response be to asking each alumni to donate \$10 or \$25 for a stained glass window in the old entrance or the old taxi entrance to Saint Marys. A recent phone call regarding old student textbooks reminds me we are still interested in any correspondence you might have had with any of the Sisters or instructors we had in training. Old textbooks after 1930 can be tossed.

Sister Amadeus was know to many of us as a gentle, kind lady who cared about her students as well as her patients. She was respected by patients and their families, nurses and doctors. Margaret worked with legislators are the state and national levels lobbying for many important changes in the nursing profession. Ida Chiyoko Sakohira Kawaaguchi '46 was a great support to Thelma Robinson assisting to recruit nisei cadet nurses to participate in Thelma's second book which has been translated into Japanese.

My sincere sympathy to all of you that have lost family and friends this past year.

I receive so many emails and cards from Alumni thanking the Alumni Board for keeping the Alumni and reunions "alive". We will continue our goal of annual reunions through 2020, the year the last class of 1970 to celebrate their 50th. Thank you all who take the time to write. These notes are much appreciated.

More importantly, we want to be aware of your current location to keep your informed of Alumni news. HISTORY OF SAINT MARYS' NATIVITY SET

In the early 1930s, Sister Joseph Dempsey found an advertisement in the newspaper about a Nativity set and sent away for it, thinking it was a table top set. Many months passed and Sister Joseph forgot all about having placed the order. Then one day she got a call from the railroad station that a huge crate had arrived for her. Not remembering what she had ordered she asked the station master to open the crate. She learn that the crate contained a large Nativity set, she went the railroad station to have a look at it. The set was so beautiful, she decided to keep it. This particular set is unique because the nearly lifesize figures are of a single piece. Once the figures had been delivered to Saint Marys Hospital, Sister Agnella painted the background and Joseph Howlett, the hospital carpenter,

built the creche. Since that time, the Nativity has had a special place of honor in Saint Marys Chapel.

The Nativity Scene was on the front of our Christmas card from Sister Generose and Sister Lauren along with this history on the back of the card. Thank you Sisters.

SITES OF INTEREST IN ROCHESTER

Alumni may be interested in: Mayo has a Statuary Park on the West side of the Gonda Bldg (Across from St. John's Church), a historical section on the first floor of the Mayo Bldg., Saint Marys and M-K Schools of Nursing have provided artifacts of 20th century nursing on the third floor of the Plummer Bldg. The art display in the Sibens Atrium. In the Mayo nurses Atrium of the Gonda, take time to see the Forever Caring Tableau commissioned by the Mayo Clinic to honor the nursing profession. Soldiers Field Park has a nursing memorial. All is within walking distance of downtown. The Memorabilia Room in Marian hall is open throughout the reunion and year. Tours of the hospital will be available following the farewell coffee on Sunday. Independent walking tours of both hospitals and the clinic are available. Pamphlets available at all information sites.

If you have a car you might want to take a drive up to Assisi Heights (Mother House). Mayo Clinic has an agreement with the Franciscan Congregation to utilize half of the space. Mechanical, electrical communications and plumbing systems were updates. The Sisters' wing has been remodeled with larger rooms, walk in closets and with large handicap-accessible bathrooms. There has not been major changes in 50 years.

COMMEMORATIVE UPDATE

As of this writing, we have had a total of four meetings relating to the SMSN student nurse recognition. A larger committee with Mayo staff and three alumni met twice following our centennial reunion. We were told then a statue on Saint Marys Hospital grounds would not be allowed. We then talked about an etched glass glove with our nursing pin. This would be placed in the corridor of the hospital near the old taxi entrance and the hospital's memorabilia location.

Monica was notified that a design had been developed. Monica presented the design at last years' banquet. This design was turned down by the Alumni.

This winter the Alumni were informed that the project was on hold related to the economic constraints. We were told however, there is strong support for the project when conditions improve. Later this winter, Virge and Monica met with two members of the Mayo Heritage committee and provided input on appropriate articles from the SMSN memorabilia to use in an exhibit to honor nursing in Irag.




