General Information

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This comprehensive multi-day continuing medical education program in rhinology focuses on the endoscopic management of sinus and nasal disease, functional disorders of the nose, cosmetic disorders of the nose and nasal malignancies. A hands-on laboratory dissection with contemporary equipment will also be included.

COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Identify and assess patients for sinus surgery
- Identify complications during and after sinus surgery
- Formulate rationale for surgery based on the pathophysiology of chronic rhinosinusitis
- Identify the different approaches to septorhinoplasty
- Identify complications of septorhinoplasty
- Demonstrate skills for repair of nasal lesions and defects
