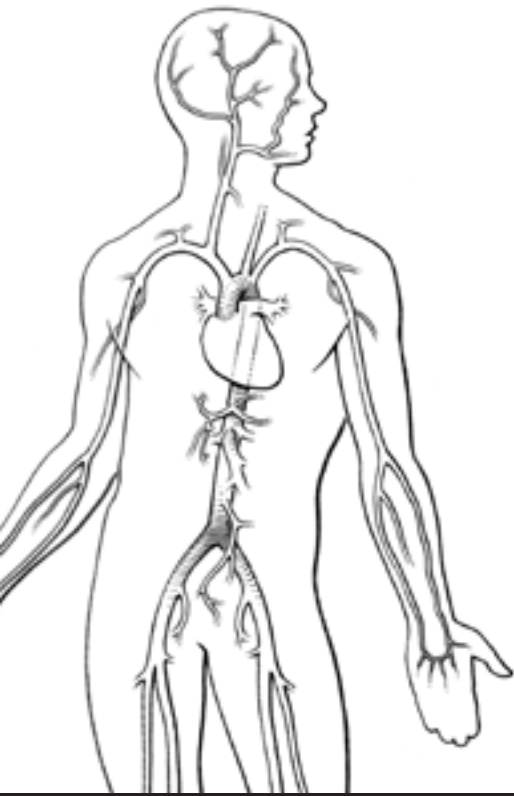

General Information

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This two-day course will provide a multidisciplinary perspective and discussion on the management of complex clinical challenges in cardiovascular medicine and surgery. Topics that will be covered include: heart failure, valvular heart disease, ischemic heart disease, aortic/vascular disease, atrial fibrillation and adult congenital disease.

Faculty, including leading clinicians in surgery and medicine from Twin Cities' practices and Mayo Clinic, will contribute to this discussion.

COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Diagnose and treat sleep apnea among patients with heart failure
- Identify patients who may be candidates for destination LVAD therapy
- Determine which patients with atrial fibrillation are best managed medically versus interventionally
- Distinguish between patients best served by open aortic valve replacement versus percutaneous aortic valve implantation
- Apply current guidelines for therapy of congenital heart disease in adults
