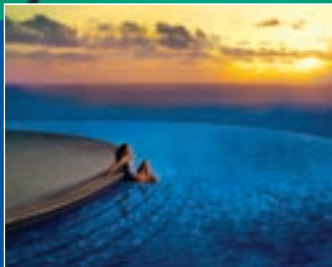

General Information

Course Description

This course is designed for all internal medicine physicians, family practice physicians, psychiatrists, other sub-specialty physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants. Its focus is on addressing practical clinical issues that arise with various medical illnesses complicated by co-morbid depression.

Course Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this conference participants should be able to:

- List a number of medical illnesses that increase risk for developing depression.
- Describe the significance of co-morbid depression or anxiety with a number of medical illnesses.
- Choose antidepressant therapy options with consideration given to co-morbid medical conditions.
- Discuss the significance of the cytochrome P450 system and drug-drug interactions with the use of antidepressant medications.
- Distinguish between hypokinetic delirium and depression.
- Describe how cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) and self-management strategies can be used to improve depression.
- Distinguish between sleep disorders and sleep problems with depression.
- Discuss ways to optimize the treatment of depression and anxiety in children.
- Discuss the interaction between pain disorders and depression.
- Discuss the complexities that arise in treating bipolar depression.
- Discuss the neuroanatomy of depression.

Ground Transportation
