Dr. Sairam Parthasarathy is the Murray and Clara Walker Endowed Chair and Chief of the Division of Pulmonary, Allergy, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine, Founding Director of the UAHS Center for Sleep, Circadian and Neurosciences Research Center at the University of Arizona. He has a broad background in translational and clinical research with emphasis on intervention-based approaches in sleep, COVID, and health disparities. His current research work is focused on as Principal investigator for the following research: (a) Arizona statewide endeavor community engaged research alliance addressing social determinants of health (NIH-CEAL Alliance; Arizona-CEAL); (b) RECOVER long-COVID Adult Cohort study and RECOVER Clinical Trials that is aimed at studying the epidemiology, etiology, and treatment of post-acute sequelae of SARS-CoV-2 infection; (c) health-services research in sleep medicine with emphasis on patient-centered approaches and dissemination-implementation aspects of interventions aimed at addressing health literacy in health disparate populations.
